STUDENT AUDITIONS FOR: "A Night Full of Stars"

WHAT WILL THE AUDITION FORMAT BE?

- Auditions will take place from 10:30-11:45 on Sunday, August 20 and Sunday, August 27 in Room 2500 (4th/5th Grade Boys' Classroom). If your child desires to audition but is unable to make either audition date, please contact Jenny Vicenik at jen7keps@yahoo.com
- Children will audition in small groups (a schedule will be sent out a few days before your child's audition date).
- Children will be evaluated in area(s) of speaking, singing, and basic motions. This will include volume and expression (speaking) and volume, pitch, and expression (singing), and basic coordination.
- Several adults working with the program will listen to and evaluate kids in each area.
- Process will be as fair and equal as possible.
- Parents and students are welcome to sit and observe quietly during auditions.

HOW WILL WE BE NOTIFIED OF A SPEAKING OR SINGING ROLE?

- Students who are selected for a main speaking; or solo role will be contacted (by phone) following the August 27th audition date.
- A PARENT AND STUDENT meeting for those with a speaking role in "KidsCreek Christmas: A Night Full of Stars" will be held on Wednesday, September 6th from 5:15-6:15 PM at Church in the KidsCreek Clubhouse. Scripts will be distributed at this point in time.

WHAT DOES MY CHILD NEED TO KNOW / PREPARE?

1. SINGING- - - Each child will be asked to sing "Jesus Loves Me" without accompaniment.

3. SPEAKING PORTION- - - Children will all be asked to read one or more of the following speaking parts (they do not need to be memorized). However, please note that your child is not necessarily auditioning for this specific part. Rather, we are trying to assess speed, annunciation, clarity, volume, and expression of speaking. (NOTE: If your child is not yet able to read, we will work with him/her to "repeat" lines. Your child will NOT be penalized if he/she is not yet able to read fluently.)
